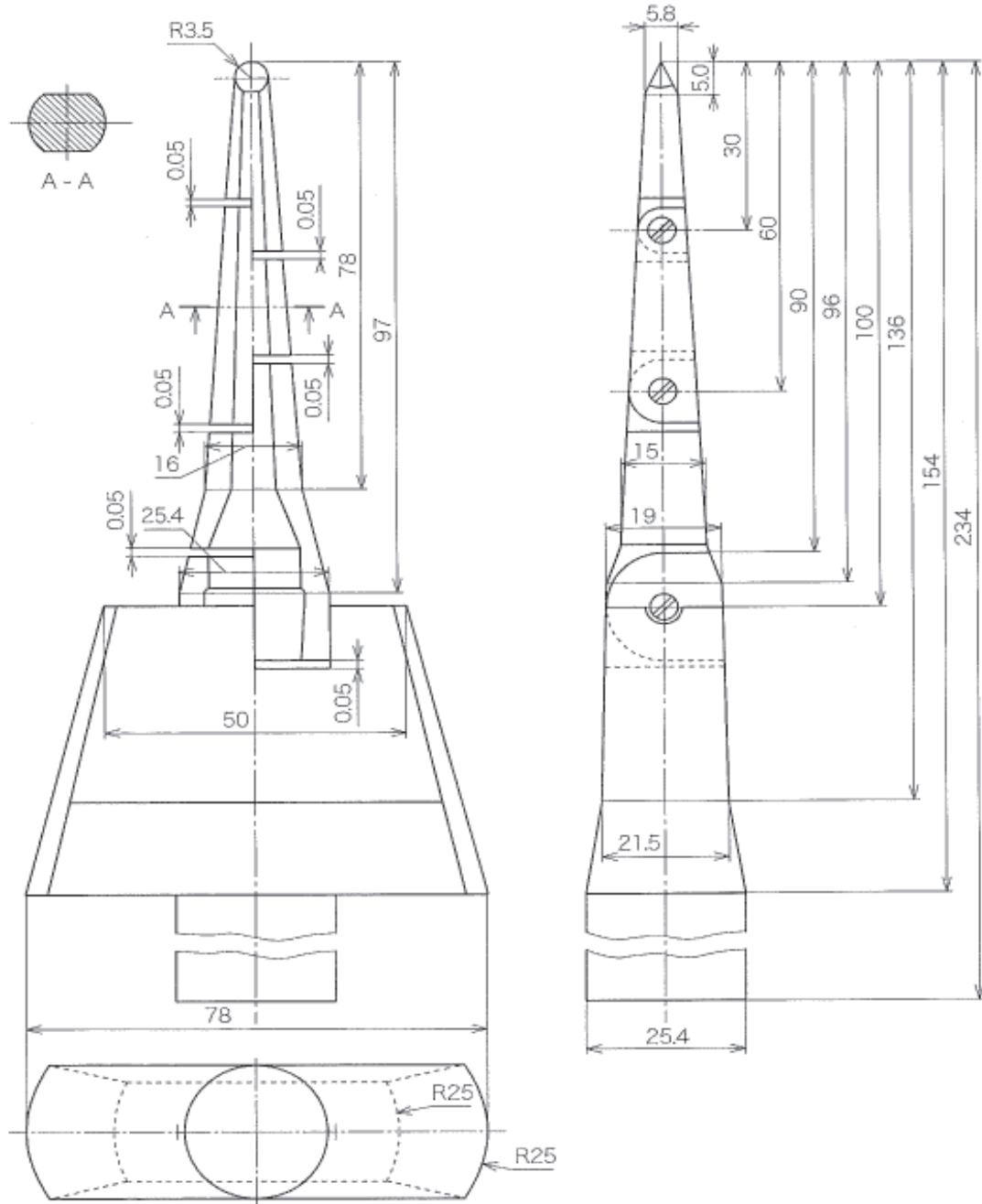
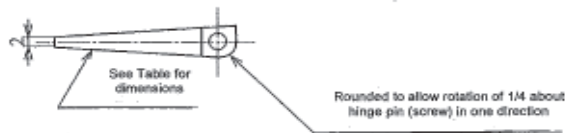
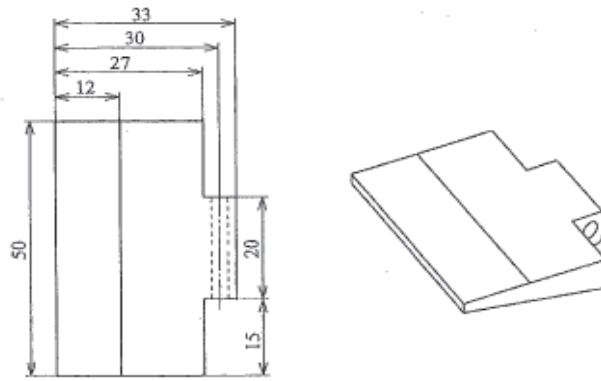
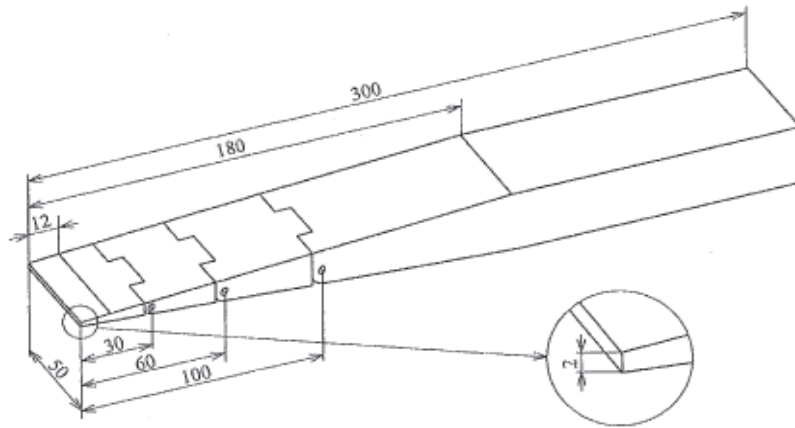


Figure JA.1 Test finger

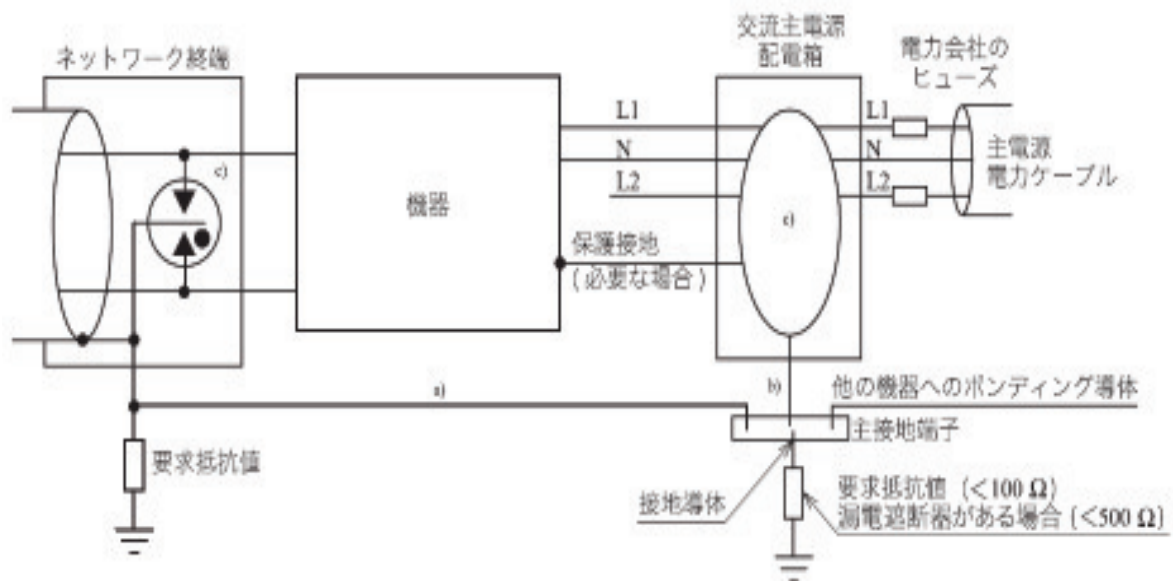

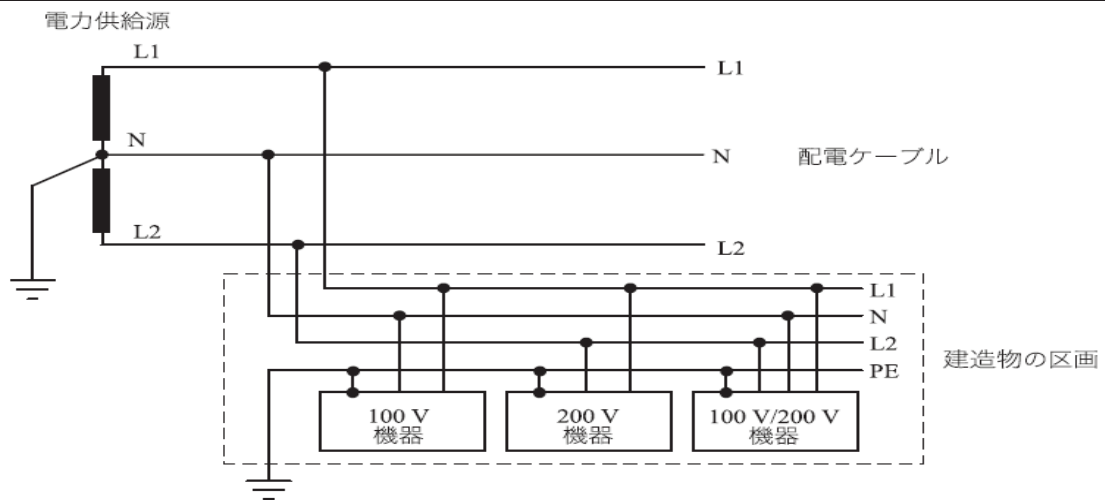

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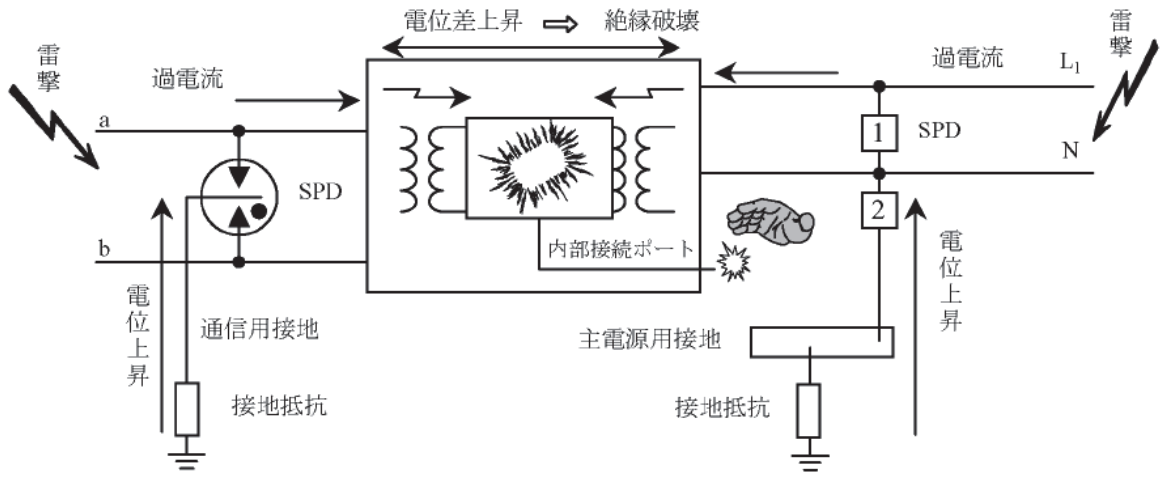


Figure JB.3 - Insufficient grounding and setting environment of bonding

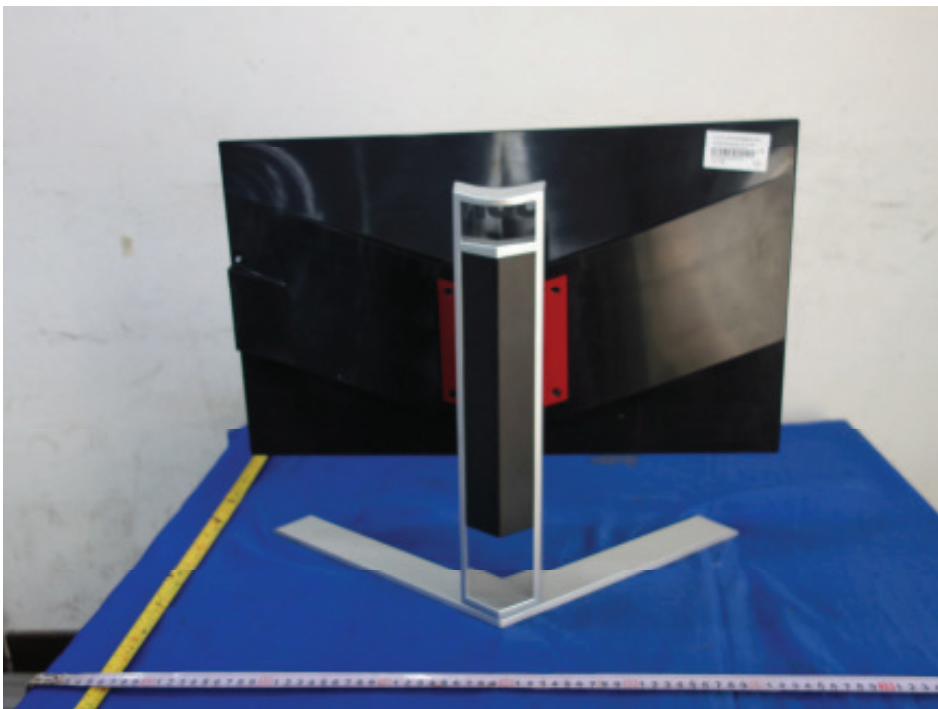


Figure 2. Rear view with horizontal position

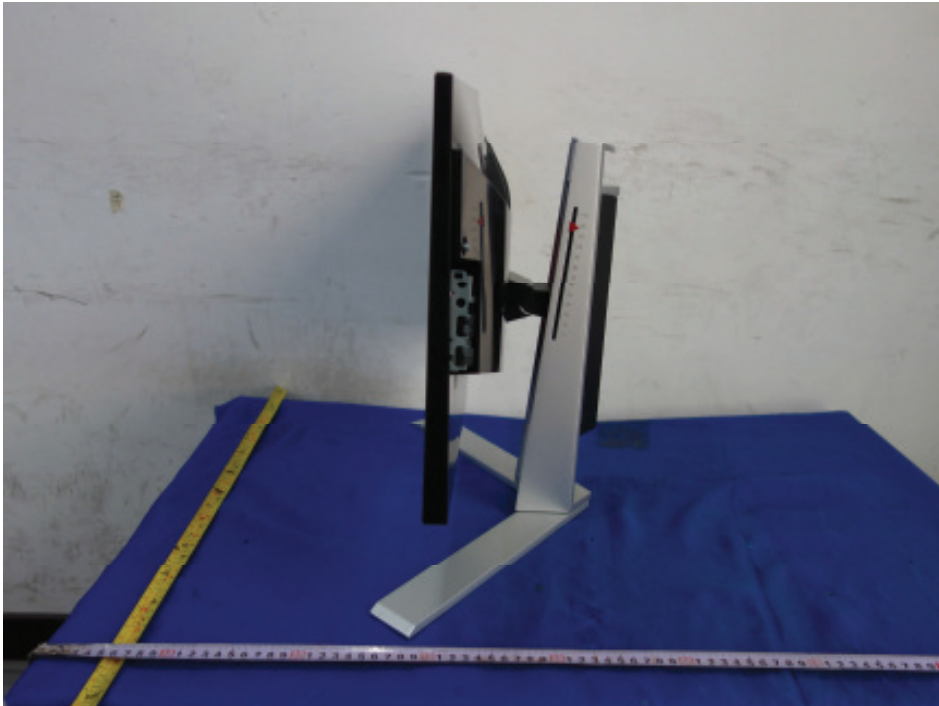


Figure 3. Side view with horizontal position

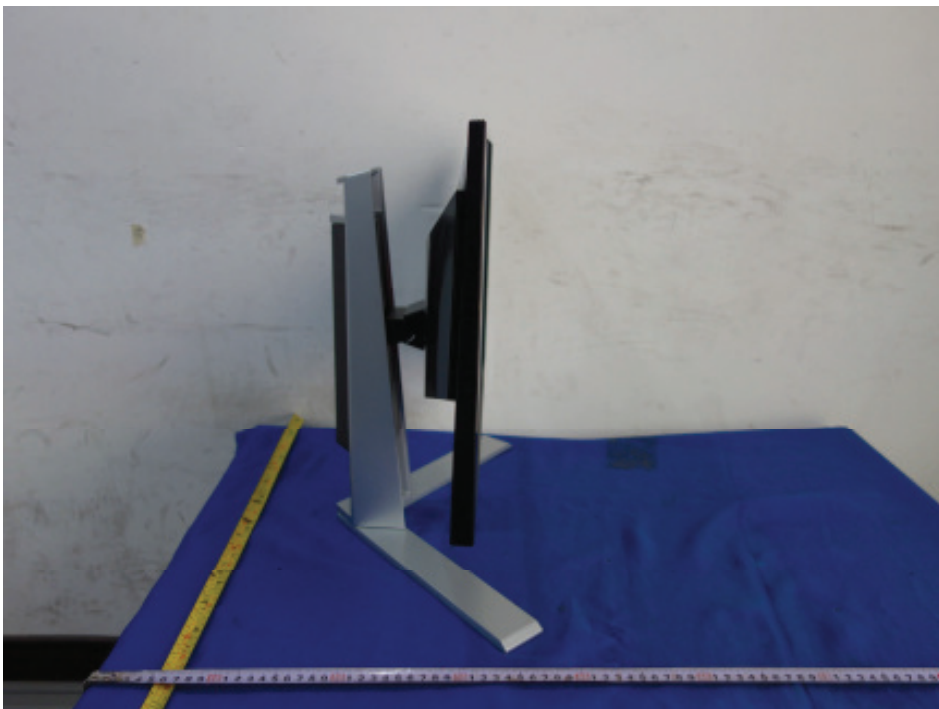


Figure 4. Side view with horizontal position

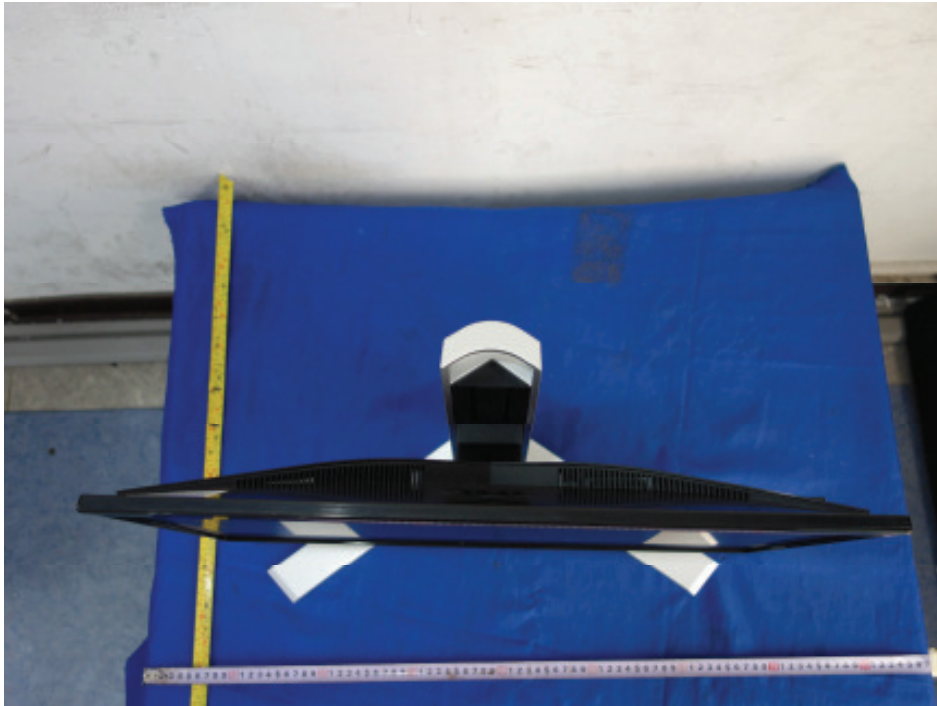


Figure 5. Top view with horizontal position

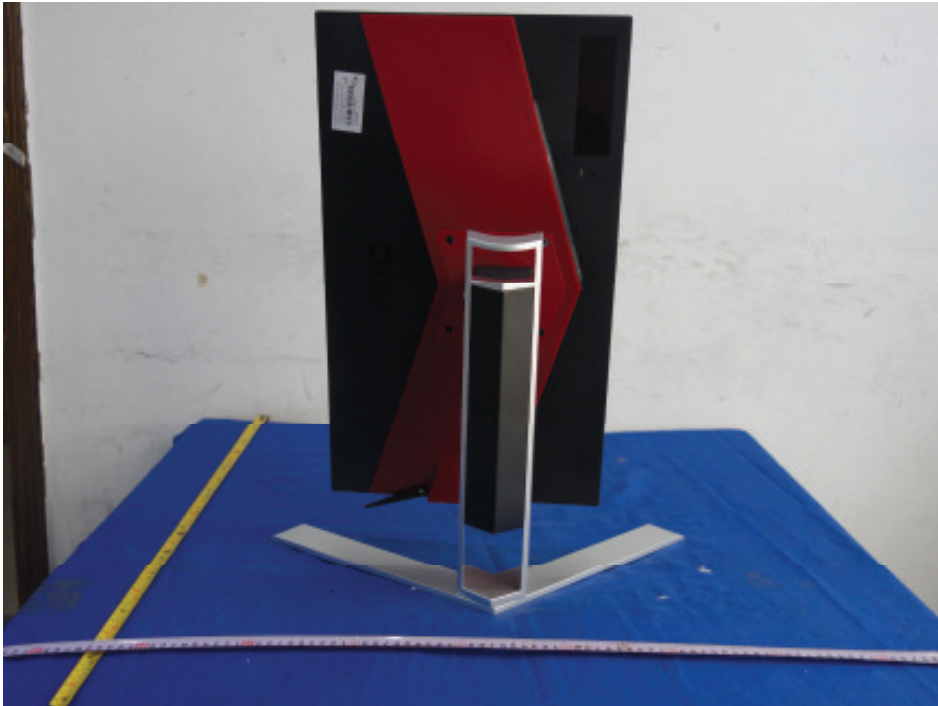


Figure 7. Rear view with vertical position

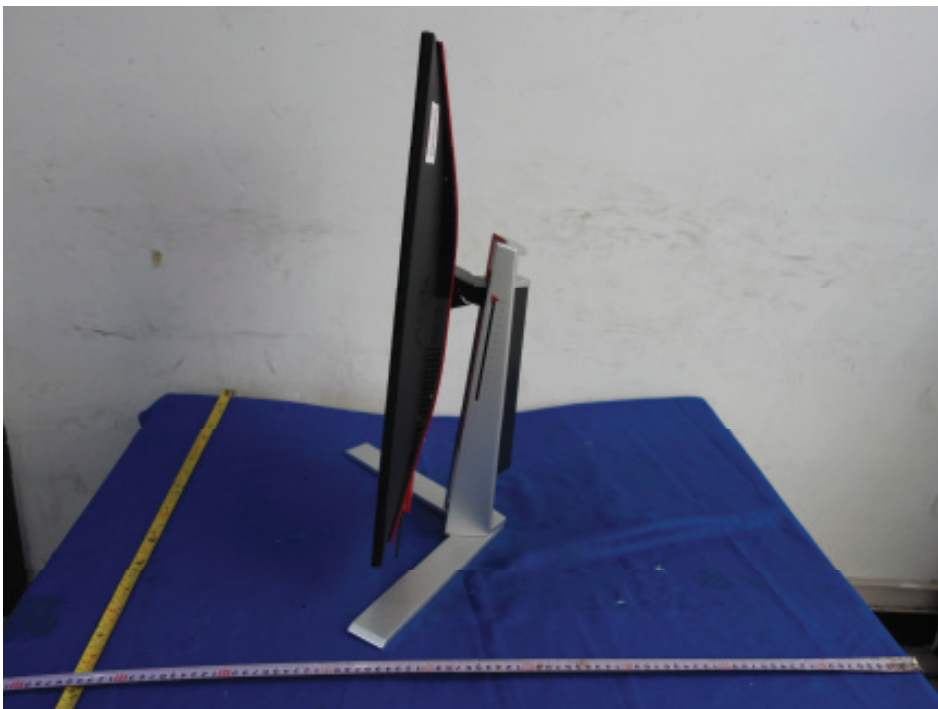


Figure 10. Side view with vertical position

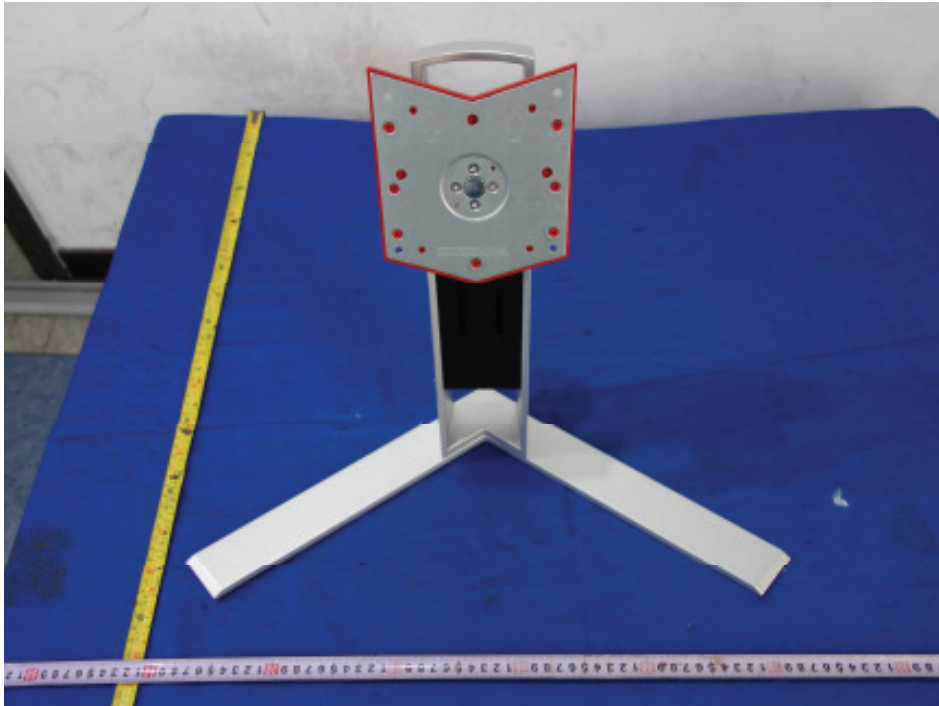


Figure 11. Base stand

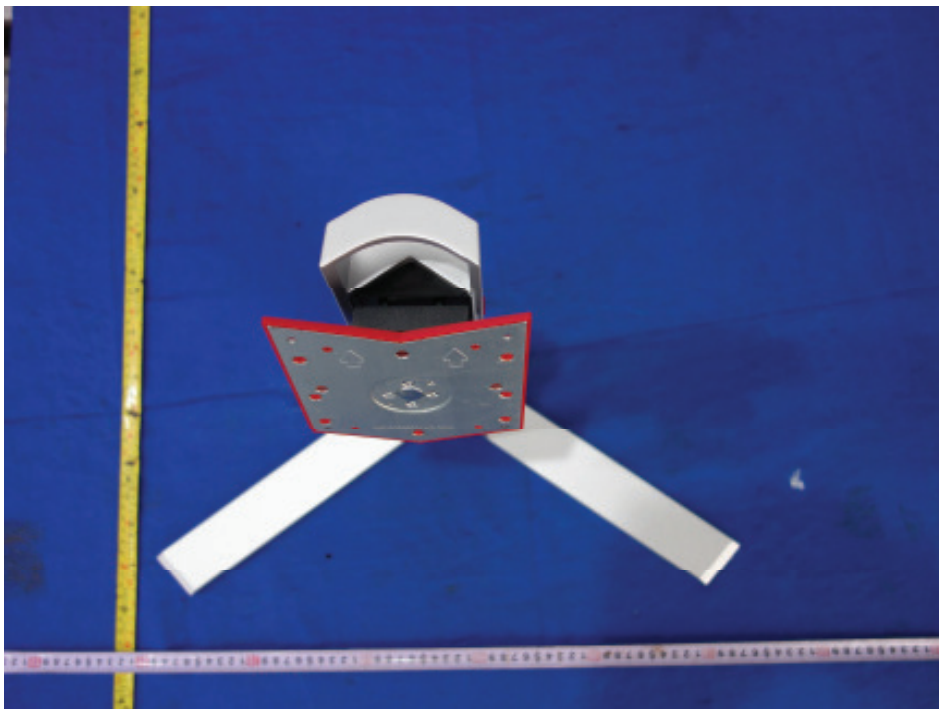


Figure 12. Base stand

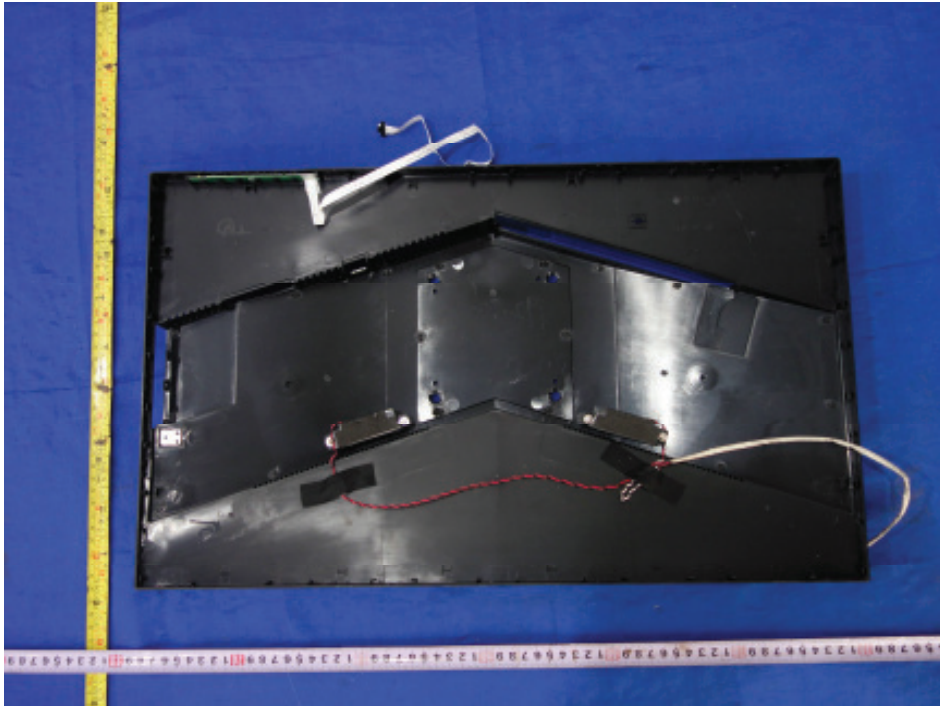


Figure 13. Internal view of rear plastic enclosure

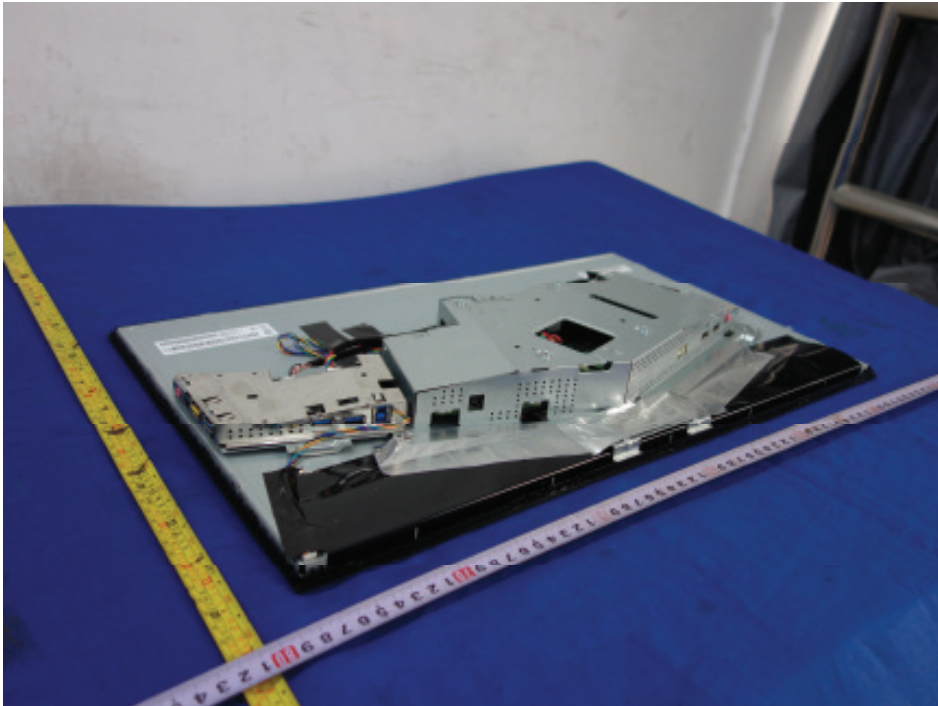


Figure 15. Internal view

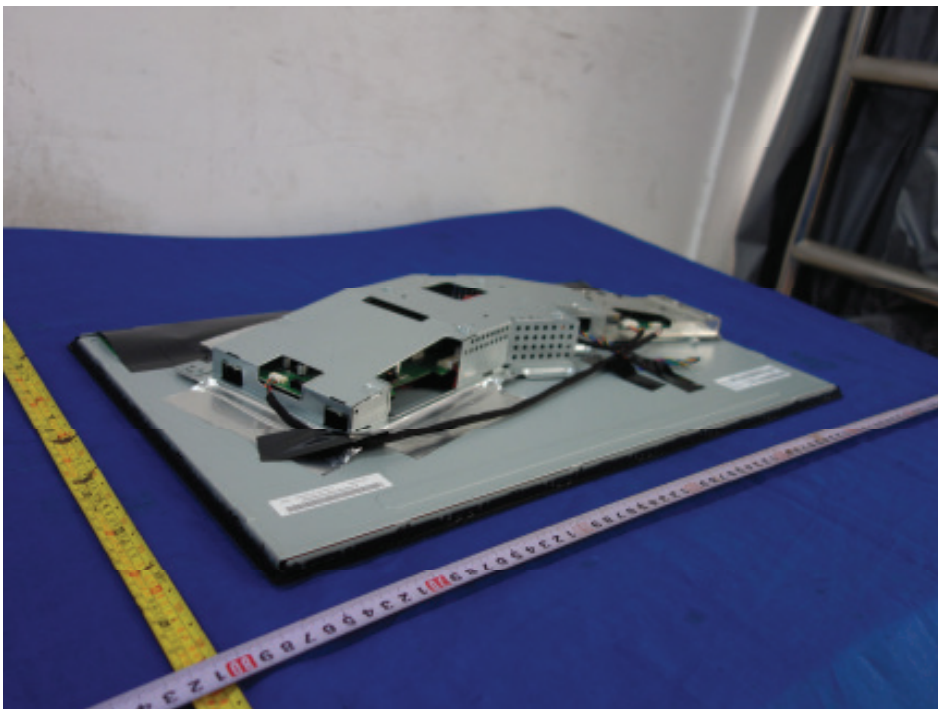


Figure 16. Internal view

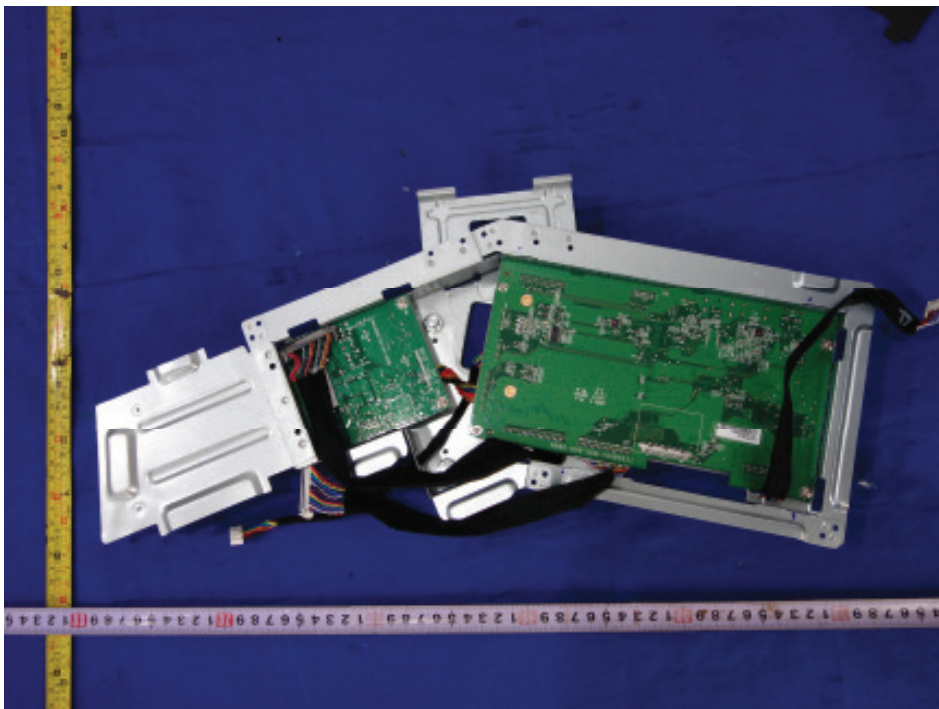


Figure 18. Internal view of metal chassis

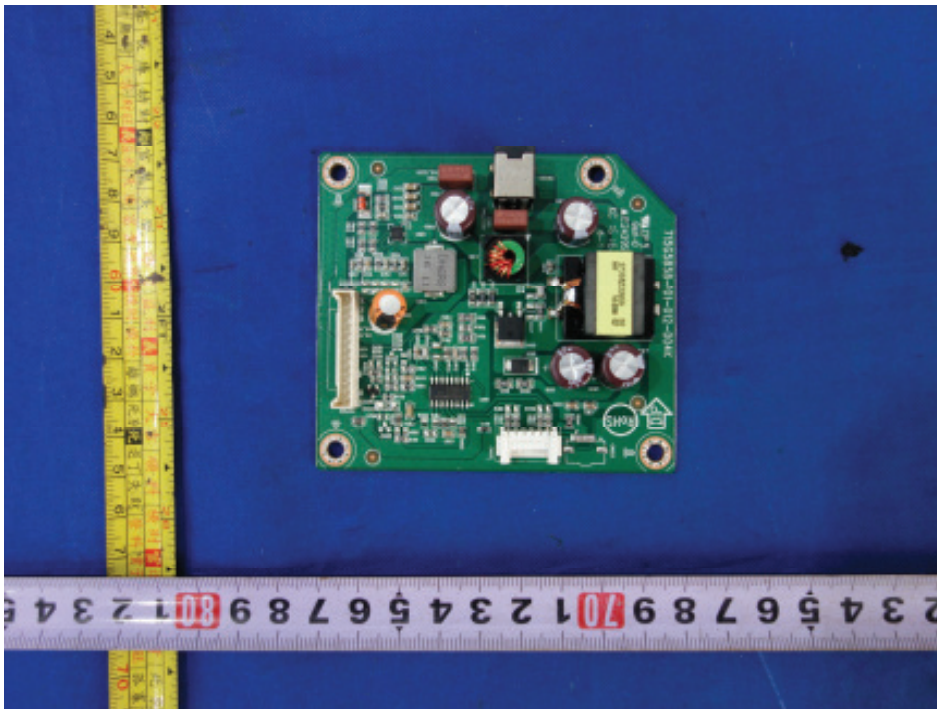


Figure 19. Converter board 715G5858

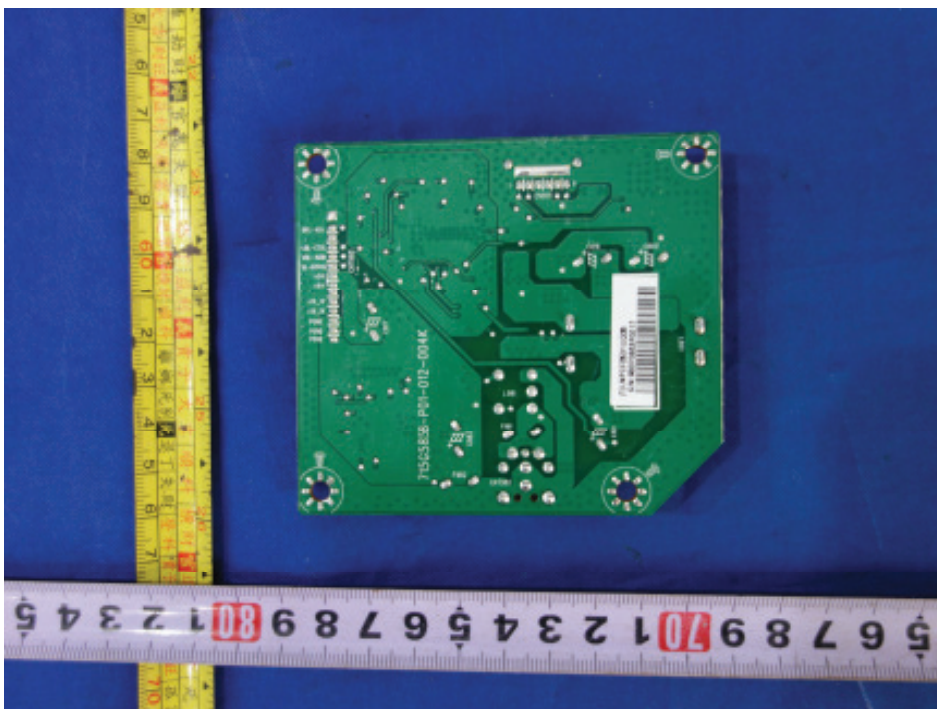


Figure 20. Converter board 715G5858

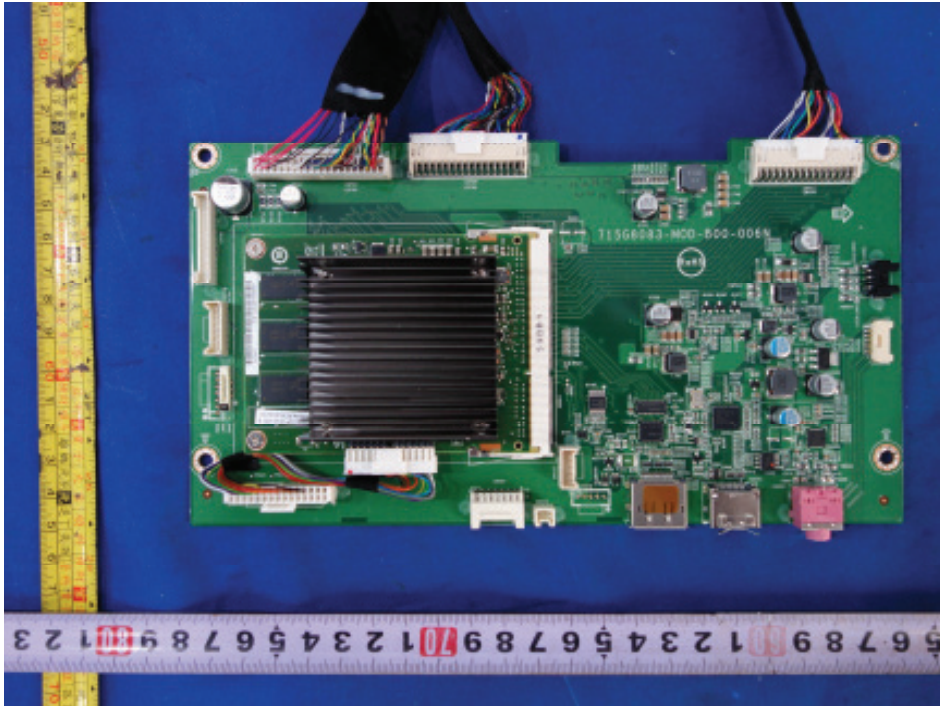


Figure 21. Main board 715G8083

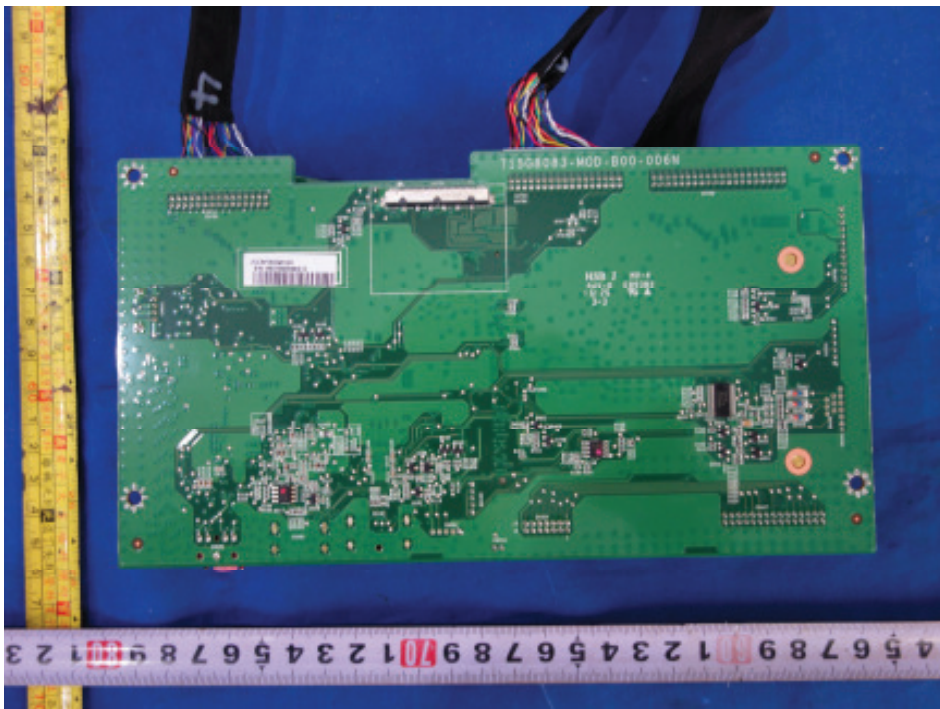


Figure 22. Main board 715G8083

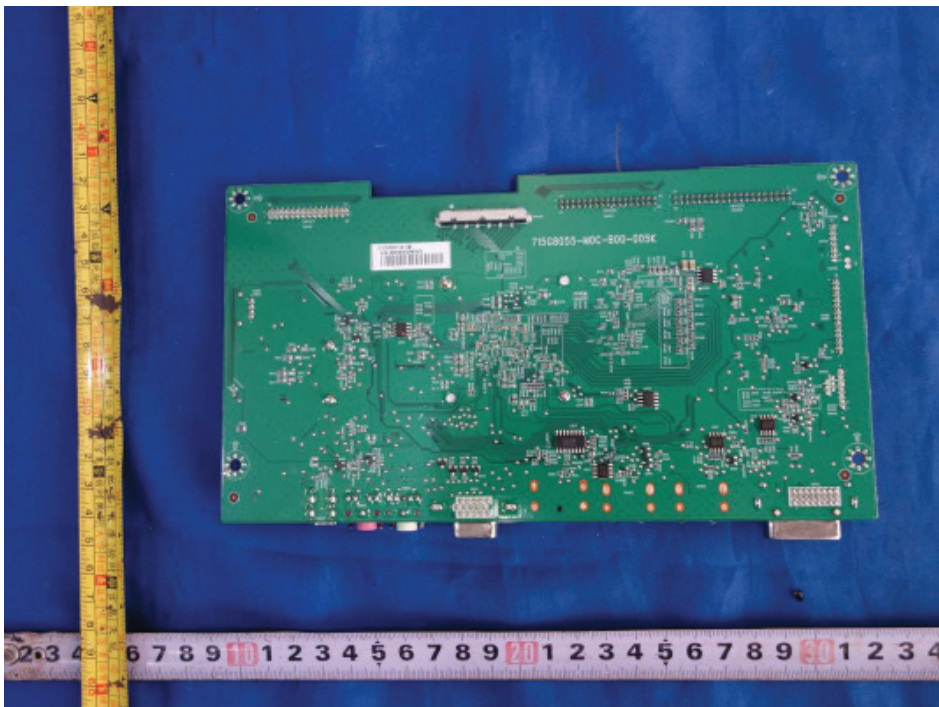


Figure 24. Main board 715G8055

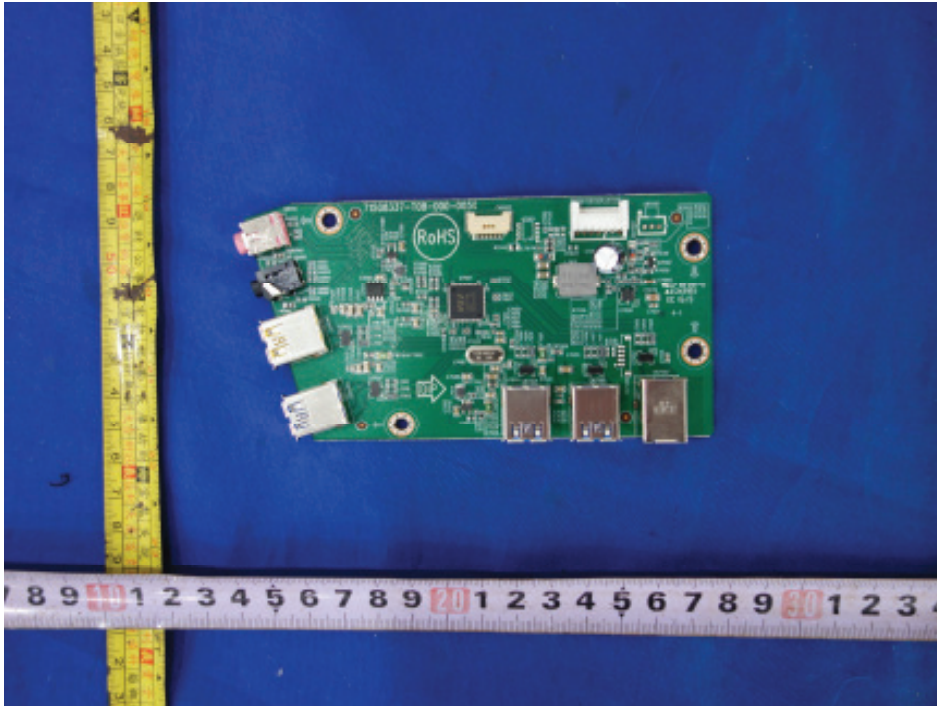


Figure 25. USB board 715G8337

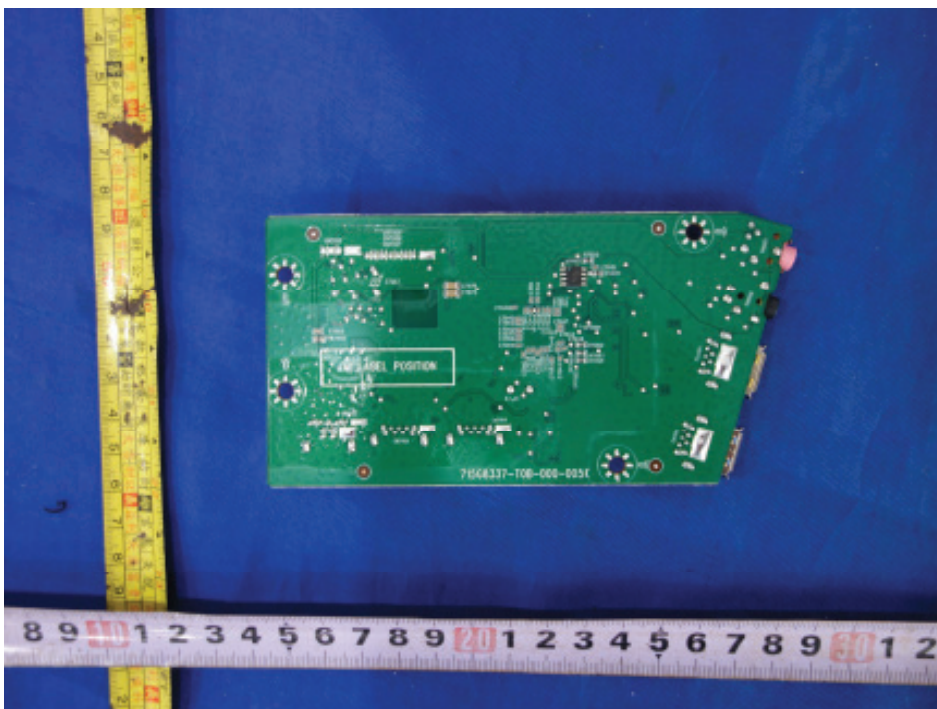


Figure 26. USB board 715G8337
