- -supply voltage, which ranged from 100-240Vac
- -operating temperature, Max. ambient temperature 40 ℃ declared by the client
- -operating mode: continuous
- -operating load:

maximum brightness, maximum contrast, full white screen; maximum non-clipped volume of speakers with 1 KHz sine-signal.







- 4. Add new model VS215DGLW, which is identical to original model VN215DGLW except for type designation.





Figure JA.1 Test finger




Figure 1. Model VS230PGLW




Figure 12. Model VS236WGLW




Figure 19. Base type C




Figure 20. Metal enclosure






Figure 21. Metal enclosure




Figure 22. Metal enclosure






Figure 23. Metal enclosure




Figure 24. Metal enclosure






Figure 25. Power board 715G4497 type A




Figure 26. Power board 715G4497 type A






Figure 27. Power board 715G4497 type B




Figure 28. Power board 715G4497 type B






Figure 29. Power board 715G4497 type C




Figure 30. Power board 715G4497 type C






Figure 31. Main board 715G5281




Figure 32. Main board 715G5281




Figure 35. Main board 715G5325




Figure 36. Main board 715G5325




Figure 38. Main board 715G3834




Figure 40. Main board 715G5270
